As we see the higher per kilo price for beef the extra Kilo's Charolais cross progeny produce starts to really mount up. There is no doubt that in the next few years we will see finishers paying big premiums for Charolais cross cattle. EID identification is a powerful recording tool for finishers to identify top performing animals and the extra weight and yield produced from Charolais will reward those that produce them. We have had a positive AGM this year in Hamner. Breeders were in good spirits. I would encourage breeders who don't get to these events to get along to them. We would always like to see more participation and your inputs are always welcome.

OBITUARY- Dorothy (Doss) Anne Gilmour

Council acknowledges the recent sad passing of Doss Gilmour. Our condolences to Bill, Stu, Bruce, Christine and families. She was a great supporter of the Charolais breed and as many of you would remember Doss, at the Greenwood Park bull sales, her extremely polite and great personality was appreciated by all. She will be very sadly missed.



DOSS'S LIFE

Doss grew up on a farm in the Argyll HB area. Her birth name Dorothy was a struggle for her to pronounce, so she told her folks that "Doss" is what she would like to be called and so it was. She developed an affinity with horses and would ride 4 or 5 miles each day to catch the bus to school. Doss's affinity with school wasn't as strong as her horses, so one day decided to ride the opposite way so she missed the bus.

On leaving school, Doss followed the concept of "Landgirls" and volunteering to look after farms while the young men went to war. Having grown up on a farm this is where her future lay.

Doss married very early in her life to Bill and she moved to the farm at Elsthorpe. It wasn't long before her desire to be actively involved in farming came to the fore and slowly became more involved in the running of the farm.

Together they had, and brought up 3 children at Elsthorpe, as well as working on the farm as the head shepherd. She had a number of horses and a team of 5 or 6 dogs, as farmwork was done on horseback back then. Doss would take the kids to horse events, and hunting etc driving the 5 ton truck with horses on the back, soon she found it too boring so, in her early 40's, she also took up hunting which she enjoyed both for the riding and the social side afterwards.

They developed the Greenwood Park Charolais Stud in the late 1960's and it was at this time it quickly became apparent that getting a vet in to artifically inseminate a cow with semen whenever they were ready, was an expensive exercise, there had to be a cheaper option, so Doss volunteered to learn how to do it. Doss became the first woman in NZ to learn how to inseminate cows and she became very skilled at it.

Doss had a good eye for stock and her input was always considered when out buying bulls and adding genetics to the herd.

Two years ago Doss and Bill finally moved off the farm at Elsthorpe to "Summerset in the Orchard" a retirement Village in Hastings.

Doss passed away on the 3rd June 2015
