The herd currently consists of around 80 breeding females with the aim of building up to 100 select cows with in the next few years. Since its establishment we have applied rigorous selection criteria being particularly strict on structural soundness and doing ability, we are proud of our female herd and feel confident that they would match up with any stud herd in the country.

Our senior herd sire **Waitapu Reflection 876** has stamped his mark on our breeding programme and has left us with strong even type of replacement heifers and a magnificent line of easy doing and docile sale bulls.

Our Gelbvieh herd was established in 1989 and has stabilised at around 60 breeding females. Those clients who purchase Gelbvieh bulls appreciate their true value particularly on the maternal side. Gelbvieh sired replacement females are in great demand throughout the country, they are docile trouble free females that require minimal attention and rarely wean a calf under 300 kgs.

We have been developing the Balancer composite over the past few years. These bulls carry a mix of Gelbvieh and Red or Black Angus genetics. They are extremely hardy and particularly popular in the US amongst cattlemen who want to breed more moderate framed cows on some of the harsher areas of the states.

A first appearance for the Gelbvieh breed at the National Beef Expo show and sale at Manfield Park in Feilding resulted in the rising two year old bull **GLADSTONE FLYING HIGH** winning breed Champion and selling for a record \$12000. He was bought by Cloudy Peak station near Fairley in the South Island. Flying High is sired by AI from imported North American bull Flying H Sculptor and out of a 13 year old home bred cow Gladstone Ruby S61.

The Reserve Champion bull **GLADSTONE XPLETIVE** also sold to the South Island to Muller Station with semen rights being retained by Maungaraki Cattle Company.

A total clearance of the Gelbvieh catalogue resulted in an average of \$5600 for the breed.

It has been a huge year for the Gelbvieh breed. In the National Steak of Origin Competition two Gelbvieh heifers made it through to the semi-finals out of over 400 entries and in the Future Beef NZ Hoof and Hook Competition a pure Gelbvieh steer from Maungaraki won Reserve OverAll Champion in the Euro section.

Whip-Lash [polled] was the pick of the 2008 bull calves; we retained him because of his great length smoothness and balance. His first crop of calves are outstanding, they display the same softness and easy doing ability as their sire.

THREE YEARS AGO we imported embryos and semen from one of the world's rarest breeds of cattle called Pustertal, there are less than 500 purebred females remaining.

They are a hardy ancient alpine breed from South Tyrol in the north east of Italy in the Dolomite mountains region. They are a distant cousin of Simmental and also related to the Pinzgau breed from Austria and the Vosgene breed from north eastern France. These tough and hardy cattle are renowned for their ability to not only survive but thrive on rough mountainous pastures foraging mainly above 2500 meters in the alpine summers.

Their other special character is the exceptional meat quality, which is considered to be somewhere between Angus and Piedmontese and Wagyu.

These traits were validated by GeneSTAR testing semen we imported from two unrelated bulls which put them in the top 10% for Food Conversion Efficiency and Tenderness.


These docile cattle colour stamp their progeny with a distinctive white stripe all the way down their back including their tail, their body colour is black or red.

Recently Sue and I spent some time in South Tyrol getting to know the Alpine habitat the Pustertal cattle live in and enjoying the company of the personalities involved in the breed, we have established some great contacts and made many friends over there.

The second consignment of pure Pustertal embryos from Europe last year resulted in another 3 heifers and 2 bulls.

We are slowly building up full blood numbers and adding to our nucleus by grading up from our Simmental and Gelbvieh base cows.

Steak of Origin **Semi Finals**

for three Maungaraki steaks

The **Steak of Origin** challenge aims to find the most tender, tastiest sirloin steak in New Zealand. It is open to beef farmers, retailers, wholesalers and foodservice.

The competition process involves an initial assessment of the sirloin steak at Carne Technologies in Cambridge. Each steak is aged for three weeks before being tested for tenderness, pH and % cooking loss. The only the most tender steaks make the semi-final and are cooked and tasted by a panel of judges in Christchurch.

Maungaraki Cattle Company again competed successfully in this event; we entered 3 heifers and a steer, all three heifers made it through to the semi finals over 400 entries were received from around New Zealand.

Our **PUSTERTAL/ANGUS** heifer got through to the semi finals in the cross bred class and our pure bred **GELBIEH** in the pure bred European also an **ANGUS** heifer from Maungaraki came through in the British bred class and made it to the semi-final.

Future Beef NZ Hoof and Hook Competition

Future Beef NZ is an exciting initiative which has been created to reshape and re-ignite the New Zealand beef industry's youth involvement, at a national level.

Events are organized to provide students with an opportunity to gain hands-on experience in the beef industry.

The main event was held at Feilding Expo Centre over the weekend preceding the National Bull sales, over 80 students with their steers competed from all around New Zealand.




